## Welcome to the MFL Sunderland Primary French podcast. Lesson 10 – Look at me

In this lesson you'll learn how to ask and answer questions about some activities, and say how good or bad at them you are. You'll also learn some French praise words to use in the classroom.

*Here are the activities that we will be using in this lesson.*

je nage            *I swim*

je lis            *I read*

je chante        *I sing*

je danse        *I dance*

je joue au football        *I play football*

Activities

*Maintenant, à toi. Ecoutez, répétez:*

je nage    (pause)    je nage    (pause)

je lis    (pause)    je lis    (pause)

je chante    (pause)    je chante    (pause)

je danse    (pause)    je danse    (pause)

je joue au football    (pause)    je joue au football    (pause)

If you want to say how well you can do these activities, you use some words that you will recognise from Lesson 3B "Saying how you feel".

bien      *well*

très bien      *very well*

mal      *badly*

*Ecoutez, répétez.*

*Then just combine these with the activities like this:*

je nage très bien      *I swim very well*

je danse mal      *I dance badly*

*Here's how to ask your pupils about the activities. Note the intonation – the voice rises at the end of the question.*

tu nages ?      *do you swim ?*

tu lis ?      *do you read ?*

tu chantes ?      *do you sing ?*

tu dances ?      *do you dance ?*

tu joues au football ?      *do you play football ?*

*Maintenant, à toi. Ecoutez, répétez:*

tu nages ?      (pause)      tu nages ?      (pause)

tu chantes ?      (pause)      tu chantes ?      (pause)

*As an alternative way of answering, your pupils could practise answering "yes" or "no" to these questions. Here's how.*

oui      *yes*

non      *no*

Asking questions

*Here are some praise words that you can use in your French lessons and, of course, elsewhere in the curriculum.*

bravo *bravo, well done*

super *super, really good*

chouette *great*

fantastique *fantastic*

*Ecoutez, répétez.*

bravo (pause) bravo (pause)

super (pause) super (pause)

chouette (pause) chouette (pause)

fantastique (pause) fantastique (pause)
