Welcome to the MFL Sunderland Primary French podcast. Lesson 34 – Diary of activities

In this lesson you will learn how to say which activities you do on different days, and ask others about theirs.

Sports

We are going to combine the days of the week that we learned in Lesson 25 and the sports that we learned in Lesson 33 to put together some simple sentences to say on which day we'll do which sport.

Here is an example:

Lundi, je joue au football. *On Monday, I play football.*

Another suitable English translation would be "On Monday, I am playing football". The sentence is referring to just one Monday, as if it was every Monday it would be "le lundi".

Have a go at saying the French after the English.

On Thursday, I play rugby. (pause) *Jeudi, je joue au rugby.*

On Saturday, I go swimming. (pause) *Samedi, je fais de la natation.*

On Tuesday, I go cycling. (pause) *Mardi, je fais du vélo.*

On Sunday, I play cricket. (pause) *Dimanche, je joue au cricket.*

On Friday, I play tennis. (pause) *Vendredi, je joue au tennis.*

Question

Here is the question that you can ask someone else about their diary of activities.

Qu'est-ce que tu fais ? *What are you doing ?*

Maintenant, à toi. Ecoutez, répétez.

Qu'est-ce que tu fais ? (pause) Qu'est-ce que tu fais ? (pause)

To ask the question about a specific day, simply add the day of the week at the end of the sentence. For example:

Qu'est-ce que tu fais mercredi ? *What are you doing on Wednesday ?*

Qu'est-ce que tu fais samedi ? *What are you doing on Saturday ?*

That's the end of this podcast. If you think you need a bit more practice, go back to the beginning and work through the activities again.
