
-ĀRE verbs



- The part of the verb that ends in -āre is called the infinitive.
- In English, the infinitive starts with the word "to", followed by the name of the verb.
- -āre verbs are the first conjugation, or group, of Latin verbs.
- The -are group of verbs is the biggest group.


amāre	to love
am <mark>ō</mark>	I love
am <mark>ās</mark>	you love (one person)
am <mark>at</mark>	he / she loves
amāmus	we love
am <mark>ātis</mark>	you love (more than one person)
amant	they love

To make the part of the verb that you need, chop off the -āre to make the stem, then add the right ending.



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
