
## -**ĒRE** verbs



- The part of the verb that ends in -ēre is called the infinitive.
- In English, the infinitive starts with the word "to", followed by the name of the verb.
- -ēre verbs are the second conjugation, or group, of Latin verbs.
- The -ere group of verbs is the third biggest group.


ridēre	to laugh
rid <mark>eō</mark>	I laugh
rid <mark>ēs</mark>	you laugh (one person)
rid <mark>et</mark>	he / she laughs
rid <mark>ēmus</mark>	we laugh
ridētis	you laugh (more than one person)
rident	they laugh

To make the part of the verb that you need, chop off the -ēre to make the stem, then add the right ending.



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
