


-ĒRE verbs



- The part of the verb that ends in -ēre is called the infinitive.
- In English, the infinitive starts with the word "to", followed by the name of the verb.
- -ēre verbs are the second conjugation, or group, of Latin verbs.
 - The -ēre group of verbs is the third biggest group.

| rid <mark>ēre</mark> | to laugh |
|----------------------|----------------------------------|
| rideō | I laugh |
| ridēs | you laugh (one person) |
| rid <mark>et</mark> | he / she laughs |
| ridēmus | we laugh |
| ridētis | you laugh (more than one person) |
| rid <mark>ent</mark> | they laugh |

To make the part of the verb that you need, chop off the -ēre to make the stem, then add the right ending.
